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Students start Year 11 with 60% of their final grade secured as the controlled assessment has been completed in Year 10. The remaining 40% is awarded through the external examination in Year 11, which is completed on-screen. The examination is based on **Unit 1: ICT in Society**.

How does this year deliver your curriculum intent?

Throughout Year 11, students will cover three overarching topics, which includes how IT can be used to fulfil the needs or organisations and individuals, how data is transferred and the impacts of IT. Throughout these topics, students will be able to reflect on real life examples to develop their awareness of the role that modern technology plays on every day routines. Students will be assessed throughout the year to ensure they are aware of their weaknesses in order to be fully prepared for the final examination in the Summer. In addition to this, students will be given an opportunity to return to prior learning and spend the final half-term revising and consolidating their understanding of these topics, in readiness for their exam.
